Message from he President & Board Chair

As the year commenced, Cheekwood Estate & Gardens captured national attention with the airing of three *Antiques Roadshow* episodes, filmed the previous year. This brought significant recognition to the estate as a featured destination for one of PBS's longest-running, top-rated shows reaching five million viewers.

Spring heralded the stunning *Cheekwood in Bloom*, showcasing 250,000 spring bulbs in full splendor, followed with exhibitions featuring internationally acclaimed artists - Bruce Munro, celebrating his 10th anniversary at Cheekwood and, Carmen Herrera, whose bold and brilliant contemporary sculptures adorned the central gardens and great lawn of the Mansion.

A notable highlight of the year was the spring opening of the Garden Gift Shop, which expanded Cheekwood's retail offerings. The shop, renovated from a meeting room in Botanic Hall, is now visible to all guests entering and exiting the property, promising increased revenue for the institution. Capital restoration projects continued with updates to most administrative spaces, the rebuilding of the Howe Garden's shed, and much-needed paving of driveways and parking areas, with plans in progress to address the devastating loss of Cheekwood's boxwoods resulting from the 2022 winter freeze.

Harvest at Cheekwood featured the iconic Pumpkin Houses and introduced a Chrysanthemum-constructed pumpkin topiary, in addition to the annual Harvest Scarecrow Trail and Halloween Pooch Party. *Holiday LIGHTS*, one of Nashville's most cherished family traditions, achieved its second-highest attendance. This annual favorite showcased a candy cane and gingerbread theme in the Historic Mansion and featured an Enchanted Esplanade outdoors, complementing the 100 miles of lights across the garden, including 120 wrapped trees. Military Mondays offered discounted admission for active and retired military personnel and included the debut of a gift drive for military families.

Multicultural festivals spanned the year including Holi in the spring, Black Arts Bash in the summer, and autumn's Japanese Moon Viewing and El Día de los Muertos, Middle Tennessee's largest Hispanic festival, as Cheekwood continues to celebrate and welcome all cultures and traditions in its programming. In 2023, more than 100 musical performances in all genres set the ambiance throughout the gardens during seasonal festivals and events.

Throughout the year, from January to December, Cheekwood extended its warm hospitality to nearly 400,000 guests, maintaining its position as the third most-attended destination in Nashville, an oasis for our community and a beacon for those seeking the inspiration of beauty and art that captivates the mind and nurtures the soul.

Cheekwood Capital Plan

Caring for an historic estate takes considerable research and investment. Cheekwood has developed a rolling 10-year Capital Plan to ensure proper and timely maintenance of the estate's 90,000 square feet of facilities and 55-acre property. The Plan was formulated using a third-party study of buildings, including the Historic Mansion and Museum, as well as internal review of property and equipment records. The Capital Plan calls for Cheekwood to spend \$20 million over the next 10 years, an average of \$2 million per year, on buildings and facilities, garden and support infrastructure, and equipment replacement. The Plan will be funded through positive annual operating results, government grants and programs, and community fundraising.

Significant Capital Plan accomplishments in 2023 included the renovation of the administrative, catering and workroom facilities of Botanic Hall. This phase completed the entire renovation of Botanic Hall, many areas of which had not been updated since its construction in 1970. Other staff and work areas across the Estate were also updated in 2023. The walls of the beloved Howe Garden tool shed were deconstructed and rebuilt to ensure the strength of the structure for years to come. With donor support, Cheekwood's main drive and parking lots were resurfaced. Several projects in the Historic Mansion and Museum were in progress at the end of 2023, including security camera and lighting upgrades as well as updates to the Loggia and Mansion Gift Shop. Future restoration is being planned for the historic Gate Lodge, the Mansion's 91 windows, and the historic water features and ironwork across the property.

2023

Replant, Restore, Renew

The December 2022 freeze in Nashville resulted in significant loss of trees and horticulture. In the spring of 2023, Cheekwood launched a Replant | Restore | Renew initiative to raise funds to address the horticulture damaged and lost during this time. The most notable loss was to the historic boxwood gardens surrounding the Mansion, as hundreds of boxwoods were catastrophically damaged. Boxwoods have always been a character-defining feature of the landscape at Cheekwood. They were an important and enduring component of designer Bryant Fleming's original vision, as well as a favorite pastime for the Cheek family, especially Leslie Cheek, Sr., who had been acquiring specimen boxwood throughout the South for years before building Cheekwood. He continued to do so until his death in 1935. As such, boxwoods were established as Cheekwood's first horticultural plant collection.

The Cheek family's passion for collecting and displaying boxwoods is evident in a series of letters exchanged between family members from 1933 to 1952. The letters describe maintaining the boxwoods through storm damage, and separate resources describe daughter Huldah's later efforts to maintain the boxwood plantings by replacing many specimens after the winter of 1951. Boxwoods have helped mark the timeline in the garden throughout Cheekwood's history, and the iconic plants are firmly in the center of Cheekwood's ongoing efforts to replant, restore and renew.









Winter of Cheekwood

To engage visitors in the Historic Mansion & Museum and other indoor spaces during winter, Cheekwood presented *Orchids in the Mansion, Winter Concert Series, American Arts & Crafts Exhibition,* and *Graphic Arts Show - The Agrarian Spirit.* Additionally, the 32nd annual Middle Tennessee Scholastic Art Awards exhibition was on view in the Frist Learning Center.





Once again, Cheekwood designed the entry garden for the long-running **Antiques & Garden Show**, which serves as a fundraiser for Cheekwood and ECON Charities.







On March 4, 2023, in conjunction with the **Tennessee Triennial for Contemporary Art**, Cheekwood celebrated the acquisition of Elizabeth Turk's *Red-cockaded Woodpecker*, the *Golden-winged Warbler* and the *King Rail*. Drawing inspiration from the songs of these endangered Tennessee birds, the sculptural grouping located on the Ann & Monroe Carell Jr. Family Sculpture Trail represents the birds through elegant totemic sound columns. Turk frequently commemorates the calls of endangered and extinct birds in her work by using printed sound waves generated during song.



In May 2022, the *Antiques Roadshow* filmed appraisals at Cheekwood Estate & Gardens, with footage split into three episodes that aired in February and March 2023 as part of the beloved show's 27th season.

Attendees received free verbal valuations of their antiques and collectibles from experts working at the country's leading auction houses and as independent dealers. About 70 appraisers came to Cheekwood to examine items in 23 specialty categories, including books, collectibles, jewelry, folk art, musical instruments and more. Highlights from the appraisals at Cheekwood included a Marilyn Monroe signed autograph, 1986-1987 Michael Jordan basketball cards, and a Tiffany & Co. diamond and sapphire bracelet, circa 1960.



Cheekwood in Bloom

In 2023, **66,000 visitors** enjoyed the 250,000 blooming bulbs that created colorful displays in the Bradford Robertson Color Garden and throughout the estate for the 11th installment of *Cheekwood in Bloom*. The tulips, daffodils and hyacinths combined for a spectacular welcoming of the spring season.







Every spring, visitors at Cheekwood's **Great Spring Art Hop** hunt for eggs as well as oversized bunny murals painted by local artists. In April 2023, Cheekwood hosted 48 egg hunts with 36,000 eggs in one weekend for children in every age group.







Cheekwood welcomed 3,800 attendees to its 2nd annual Holi Celebration. The Festival of Colors is a Hindu celebration symbolizing a fresh start, much like spring itself. This educational event introduced visitors to the vibrant sights, sounds and colors of Indian culture.



Cheekwood has been designated a Center of Excellence by the Tennessee Urban Forestry Council and a Level III Accredited Arboretum by ArbNet, which makes it the perfect setting for Arbor Day. Cheekwood's **Arbor Day** celebration included guided tours of the arboretum, education programs by Root Nashville, and tree-related art workshops and resource stations. Within the over 2,100 trees on the property, Cheekwood has documented 1,267 deciduous trees, 576 evergreens, 16 deciduous conifers, and 238 dogwoods.





Summertime # Cheekwood

Throughout the summer, Cheekwood's gardens serve as a lush and living backdrop for programs that engage the community and encourage enjoyment of its 55 acres. *LIGHT: Bruce Munro* illuminated the estate and gardens in the evenings, providing an extra special ambiance. The breathtaking exhibition marked the 10th anniversary of Munro's first exhibition at Cheekwood and utilized The Ann & Monroe Carell Jr. Family Sculpture Trail, which was not accessible for Munro's first exhibition in 2013. At the center of the 10 light installations was the enchanting *Forest of Light*, which submerged visitors with 80 miles of fiber optic cable and 12,750 lighted glass spheres.

The outdoor sculpture exhibition, *Carmen Herrera: Estructuras*, included five of the Cuban-born artist's colorful, geometric, three-dimensional works throughout the gardens. Attendees of Thursday Night Out experienced a dazzling trifecta of music, contemporary sculpture, and illuminated installations.



Music initiatives flourished with the popular Under the Stars Concert Series and Thursday Night Out, featuring more than 25 concerts from May to October. In August, visitors attended Dogs Nights of Summer with their four-legged friends.

















At Cheekwood Summer Camp, children explored the gardens, made their own masterpieces, engaged with the Cheekwood GROWS Garden, and more.





Cheekwood Harvest

The more than 98,000 visitors to Cheekwood Harvest delighted in Pumpkin Village, featuring the debut of the P'Mumkin and three pumpkin houses, as well as the Scarecrow Trail and Beer Garden. About 70,000 total pumpkins were incorporated into the installations for Cheekwood Harvest 2023.









Cheekwood's annual Japanese Moon Viewing festival, or Otsukimi, takes place near the date of the Harvest Moon and is an afternoon and moonlit evening celebrating Japanese art, gardens and culture.

Every year, Cheekwood hosts the largest annual Hispanic celebration in Middle Tennessee, El Día de los Muertos. In October 2023, Cheekwood was honored at the Nashville Area Hispanic Chamber of Commerce's (NAHCC) 19th annual Business & Community Excellence Awards ceremony, where Cheekwood was recognized for its contributions to the Hispanic community and civic leadership with the "Bridges" in Art, Culture & Community Service Award.



















Holiday LIGHTS

Nashville's annual holiday celebration offered **89,000 visitors** the experience of Cheekwood's historic estate coming alive with a mesmerizing winter wonderland during *Holiday LIGHTS*. The Enchanted Esplanade was a new feature on the Carell Dogwood Trail, with trees bedazzled in colorful patterns of motion and the ground shimmering with waves of rainbow colors. The Historic Mansion & Museum was decorated with candy cane and gingerbread themes, and nearly 2,000 poinsettias brightened the Cheekwood interiors this year, including the iconic 20-foot-tall Poinsettia Tree, a tradition of the season. Familiar favorites like daytime visits with Santa, s'mores and hot cocoa, and festive workshops all season long make *Holiday LIGHTS* a beloved annual tradition.









Cheekwood's 2023 Martin Shallenberger
Artist-in-Residence, Sarah Nguyen, carves both recognizable and abstract forms out of paper fiber panels. Her exhibition, Sarah Nguyen: Tranquility was a highlight for visitors to Cheekwood during the holiday season. Her technique is reminiscent of traditional Jewish paper cutting, with intricate designs incorporating flora and fauna.

Garden Explorer

The interactive Garden Explorer tool was introduced in 2022 to engage Cheekwood visitors online and onsite. Music of Cheekwood

Each year, Cheekwood presents over 100 special musical performances and concerts featuring the region's finest players, writers, and singers shining against the backdrop of our signature lush gardens. The musical experience at Cheekwood not only piques curiosity but also draws in fresh attendees, captivates our valued members, amplifies foot traffic, and generates significant revenue. Music isn't just a backdrop; it's the heartbeat that establishes the ambiance and keeps guests delighted and enthralled.

In 2023, more than 20,000 visitors attended Cheekwood's **Thursday Night Out**, which has evolved into a quintessential weekly event that offers an adventure through food, drink and song. The event welcomes visitors from May through October to sample seasonal drinks and fare from the city's favorite food trucks, while the always diverse music lineup provides the soundtrack.







The Cheekwood Beer Garden has become a beloved attraction during Cheekwood in Bloom and Cheekwood Harvest. The exceptional musical performances at Saturday Sounds and Sunday Jazz consistently attract a lively crowd eager to experience top-tier musicians delivering vibrant full-band sets.





Summer nights invite lingering and lounging under the stars at Cheekwood, where over five spectacular evenings, music fills the air. Our **Under the Stars Concert Series** has a diverse musical lineup each year, with jazz, blues, and songwriter nights. It was voted Best Concert Series in the 2023 Nashville Scene's Best of Nashville Awards, with over 4,500 music lovers attending and 96 percent of available tickets sold.



The inaugural Cheekwood Winter Concert Series in 2023 was a testament to the power of music to transform chilly nights into unforgettable evenings. Grammy-winning virtuosos graced Cheekwood's Massey Hall stage, weaving a tapestry of musical genres that ranged from the sultry rhythms of big band jazz to the intoxicating allure of Brazilian grooves, all harmonizing seamlessly with the grace of classical melodies.



Destination Cheekwood

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

In 2023, Cheekwood welcomed 11,915 students free-of-charge from 153 schools and 25 Metro Council Districts through educational field trips. Cheekwood's annual investment in community outreach for 2023 was \$1.5 million, which went toward salaries, programming, materials and supplies, scholarships and translation services. This also includes complimentary admissions, transportation and memberships. The staff has worked vigorously to impact the Middle Tennessee region through culture, education, environmental initiatives and community outreach.

STUDENT FIELD TRIPS

Destination Cheekwood offers free field trips to all school groups from Tennessee, Southern Kentucky, and Northern Alabama. This outreach program gives children in grades pre-K through 12 the chance to spend the day at Cheekwood in the best outdoor classroom, learning about art, history and botanical gardens. Students learn about pollinators and garden ecosystems, understand how trees communicate, explore multiculturism in the Blevins Japanese Garden, and more. Every field trip curriculum is up to state standards and led by trained educators.

FAMILY FIELD TRIPS

Families from Title I schools are invited to visit Cheekwood on weekends during peak festivals to enjoy a multi-generational experience at Cheekwood. In addition to complimentary admission, families receive an orientation with translation if needed, a complimentary meal or snack and a one-year family membership, encouraging return visits throughout the year.

AGENCY FIELD TRIPS

As *Destination Cheekwood* expands, organizations serving audiences with a diverse set of needs have been welcomed to experience Cheekwood and enjoy the beauty, solace and joy of the estate, museum and gardens. In 2023, families from Nashville Freedom Schools enjoyed *Holiday LIGHTS* and Moves and Grooves families experienced the fall festivities of *Cheekwood Harvest*.

Cheekwood GROWS

In 2023, Cheekwood expanded its newest community program, Cheekwood GROWS, a free, immersive and multifaceted experience for third-grade students designed to teach gardening, healthy eating and cooking skills. The garden is home to vegetable and fruit plants for tasting, flowers to attract pollinators, and herbs to give additional flavor. Students from four MNPS schools traveled to Cheekwood throughout 2023 for hands-on learning in an outdoor garden classroom, planting their own seeds and later returning with their families to prepare dishes with the ingredients they grew, including white bean and collard greens soup, radish dip and herb dip. Summer campers and participants in the TOTS! program also engaged in the Cheekwood GROWS Garden.



Cheekwood On the Road

This outbound program takes the Cheekwood experience beyond the estate to students in Title I schools as well as to pre-kindergarten students in area Head Start programs. Elementary students explore Cheekwood's history, art collections and seasonal garden displays through educator and artistled stations. Head Start toddlers enjoy storytime and arts and garden crafts inspired by the PNC Grow Up Great curriculum, and all books and materials remain in the classroom following the program.



Multicultural Celebrations

Cheekwood is committed to embracing cultures from around the world, hosting four major celebrations annually. Each festival highlights the traditions, music, dance, art and cuisine of a culture and welcomes thousands to participate amid the beauty of the estate and gardens. Around 13,600 visitors attended our four multicultural festivals in 2023, generating some of our highest attended days of the year.

HOLI | March 25

Cheekwood hosted the 2nd annual Holi Celebration in 2023 after debuting in 2022. The Indian Festival of Colors is a Hindu tradition that symbolizes a fresh start, much like spring itself. Holi aligns perfectly with *Cheekwood in Bloom*, with its traditional color-throwing activities and dance performances adding even more vibrant colors to the spring roster and inspiring visitors of all ages.



Japanese Moon Viewing | September 24

Cheekwood hosted its 9th annual Japanese Moon Viewing festival, or *Otsukimi*, which takes place near the date of the Harvest Moon, in partnership with the Consulate General of Japan and Japan American Society of Tennessee. The event highlights artists, entertainers and vendors from the surrounding Japanese community. *Otsukimi* features tea ceremonies, mochi pounding, a Haiku competition, Japanese calligraphy and bilingual lantern-lit tours of the Blevins Japanese Garden. The Nashville Bonsai Society contributes stunning bonsai, adding a layer of horticultural depth to the event.



Black Arts Bash | August 19

Cheekwood's 3rd annual Black Arts Bash paid tribute to Black history's deep roots in Nashville and established it as one of the most anticipated events of the summer. The event spotlights both emerging and established artists across all mediums, including visual art, music, spoken word and poetry, dance, textiles, cuisine and more. The guidance and support of Cheekwood's African American Cultural Advisory Committee ensures the experience is authentic, educational and inspiring. The YMCA of Middle Tennessee distributed passes throughout the region to create awareness and expand the reach of the event.



El Día de los Muertos | October 29 & 30

Cheekwood's popular Day of the Dead festival is its most longstanding cultural celebration, a two-day event in which family and friends honor those who have passed. El Día de los Muertos features vibrant altars created by local Latino partners, music, dance, cuisine, art, activities, and vendors. For almost 25 years, Cheekwood has delivered a truly authentic experience for visitors from Middle Tennessee and beyond.
