Message *from the* President & Board Chair

In a year marked by remarkable exhibitions, captivating floral festivals, and extensive community outreach, 2024 reaffirmed Cheekwood's status as one of Nashville's top five destinations, attracting 380,000 visitors and 17,000 Members. We are thrilled to share these highlights with you and express our heartfelt gratitude for your support.

We began the year with our renowned *Cheekwood in Bloom*, celebrating France with the enchanting theme Belles Fleurs. The celebration continued in the Mansion as Cheekwood debuted its Masterpiece Art Series with *Etude de nu pour la danseuse habillée* by Edgar Degas, alongside *The Private Impressionist: Works on Paper by the Artist and His Circle*, adding an extraordinary artistic dimension to the season. We also introduced The Cheekwood Gardening School, providing the opportunity to learn from our circle of experts, inspired by the beauty of our lush gardens.

Summer brought the innovative *TROLLS: Save the Humans* garden exhibition, featuring five troll sculptures crafted from recycled materials, each delivering a powerful message of sustainability. The fall season welcomed the return of *Cheekwood Harvest*, showcasing its iconic pumpkin village.

Our 10th annual *Holiday LIGHTS* show was a festive highlight, as we added a new towering pixel tree to the Color Garden and had the honor of welcoming Laura Dowling, former Chief White House Florist, who transformed the historic Mansion into a magical winter wonderland. Complementing Dowling's installations in the Mansion period rooms, Cheekwood curated *Holidays at the White House*, depicting seasonal decorations from First Ladies Jacqueline Kennedy to Michelle Obama with images from the White House Historical Association and Presidential libraries.

Another milestone was the 25th anniversary of El Día de los Muertos, which has grown to be the largest celebration of its kind in Middle Tennessee. The Indian festival of color, Holi; the Black Arts Bash; and *Otsukimi*, a Japanese Moon viewing rounded out the year bringing multiple cultural celebrations to our gardens and museum. Our outreach efforts continued to thrive, offering free field trips for more than 13,000 students through the Destination Cheekwood and Cheekwood GROWS kitchen garden educational programs, while Cheekwood on the Road reached students unable to join us on-site, including hundreds of Head Start preschoolers.

Cheekwood has undeniably achieved exemplary status as one of Nashville's most beloved cultural institutions. We couldn't have done it without you — our visitors, Members, and donors. Your unwavering support has been instrumental in sustaining our operations and preserving our cherished historical landmark. Join us in celebrating another fantastic year, and we look forward to welcoming you again soon.

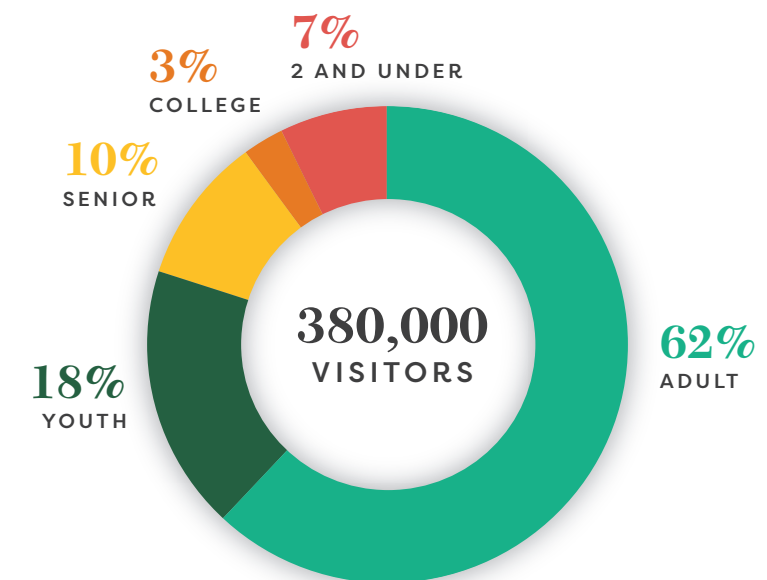

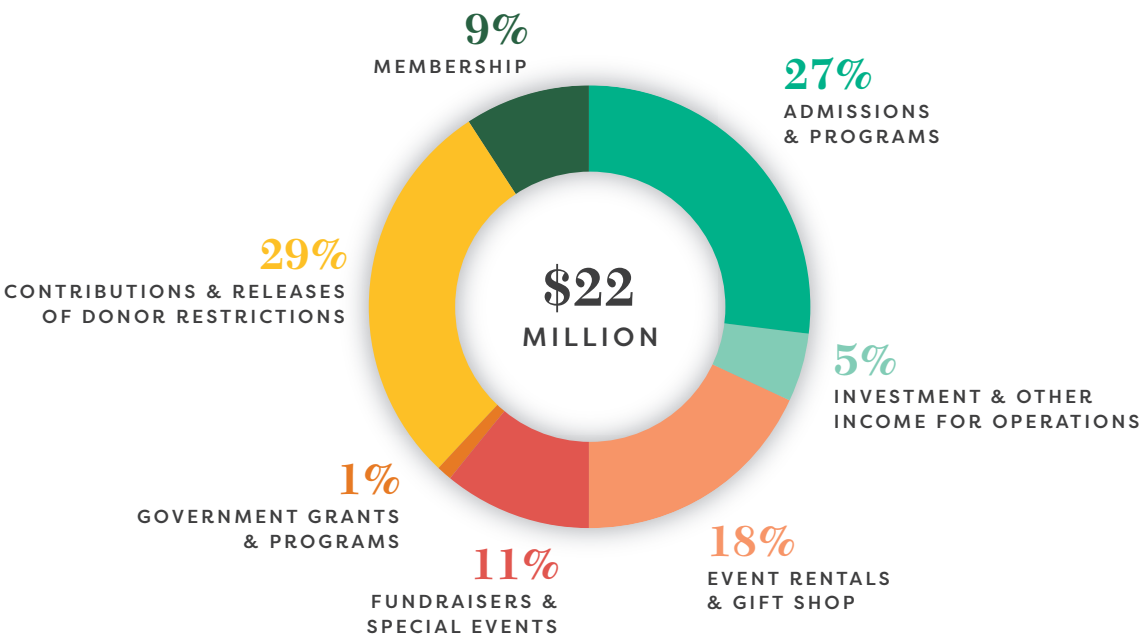

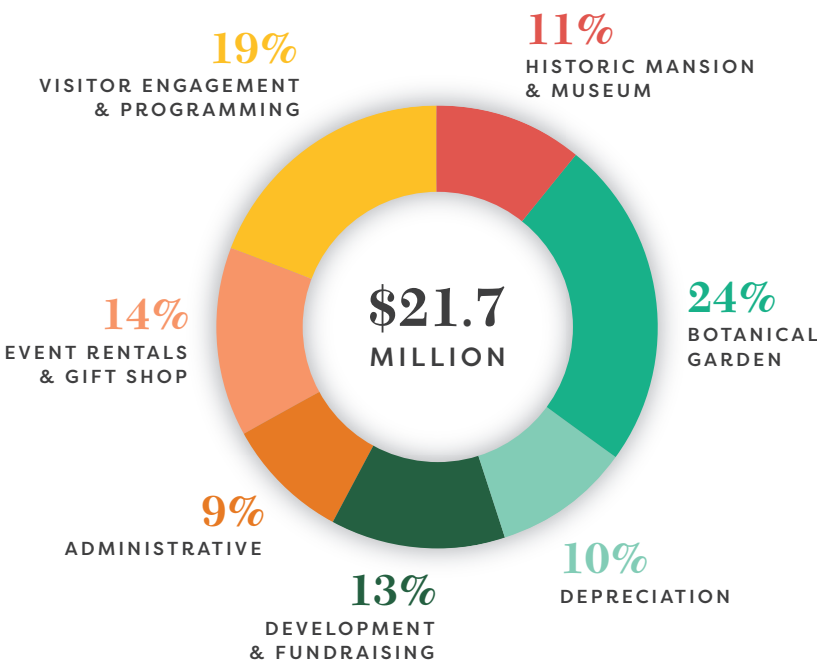

2024 SEASONAL HIGHLIGHTS

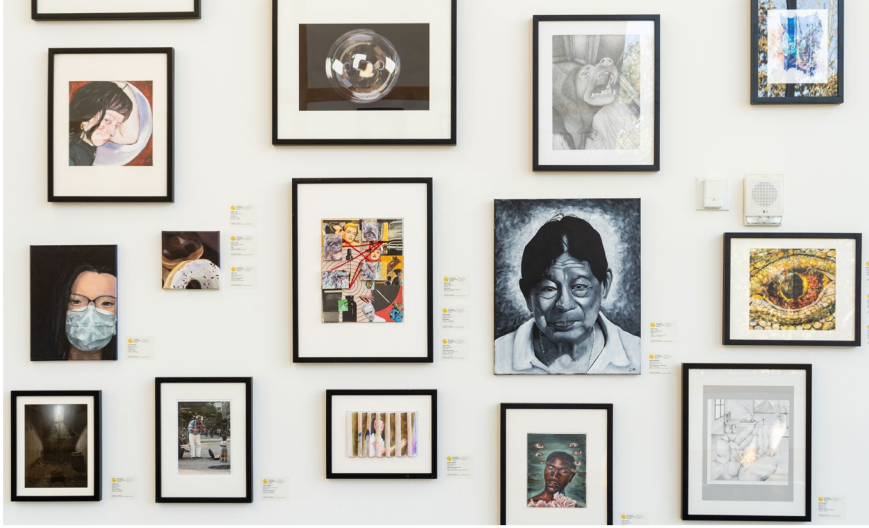
Winter *at* Cheekwood

To engage visitors in the Historic Mansion & Museum and other indoor spaces during winter, Cheekwood presented *Orchids at Cheekwood* and the *Winter Concert Series*. Additionally, the 33rd annual Middle Tennessee Scholastic Art Awards exhibition was on view in the Frist Learning Center.



The 2024 *Orchids at Cheekwood* display transported visitors to a tropical paradise. The Mansion Loggia showcased stylized columns blooming with orchids, while a lush ground layer became an interpretation of a tropical forest floor. The Botanic Hall atrium's added orchid display was a stunning welcome to the estate.

Once again, Cheekwood designed the entry garden for the long-running *Antiques & Garden Show*, which serves as a fundraiser for Cheekwood and ECON Charities.



Nashville Mayor Freddie O'Connell and Cheekwood President Jane MacLeod celebrated the artistic achievements of middle and high school students at the 33rd annual *Middle Tennessee Scholastic Art Awards*.



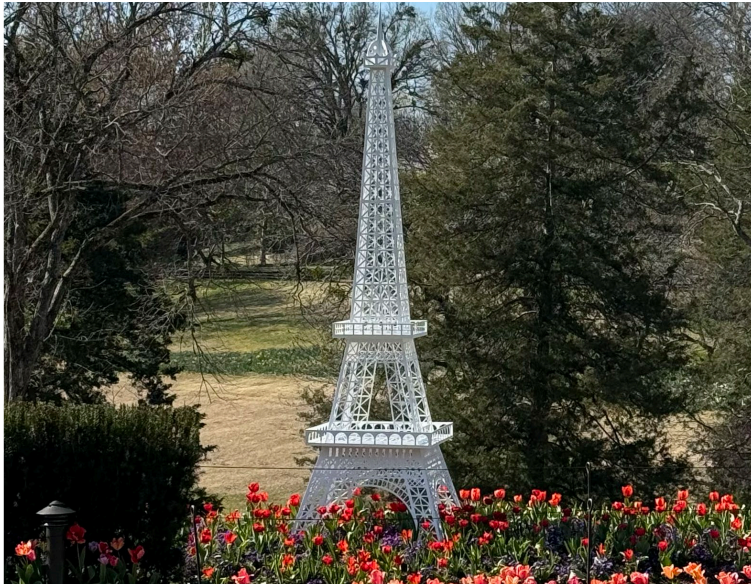
For the second year, the *Winter Concert Series* brought warmth into winter evenings with three concerts featuring the *Nashville Orchestra Big Band*, *New Orleans Mardi Gras Music*, and the *Music City Latin Orchestra*.



2024 SEASONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Cheekwood *in Bloom*

In 2024, **62,000 visitors** enjoyed the 250,000 blooming flowers that created beautiful displays in the Bradford Robertson Color Garden and throughout the Cheekwood estate. The 12th installment of *Cheekwood in Bloom* featured a French theme, *Belles Fleurs*, with a nod to classical French garden design. Warm pinks, apricots, and lavenders balanced bolder expressions of red and yellow to echo impressionism, and a model of the Eiffel Tower provided a perfect backdrop for the tulips, daffodils, and hyacinths.



Cheekwood debuted **The Masterpiece Art Series** in 2024, dedicated to showing a single or small grouping of iconic, world-renowned masterworks. The inaugural exhibition featured *Etude de nu pour la danseuse habillée*, by **Edgar Degas** (1834-1917). The bronze sculpture, *Nude study for the clothed dancer*, was a rare loan from the Marlene and Spencer Hays Collection.

Cheekwood also presented *Edgar Degas: The Private Impressionist Works on Paper by the Artist and His Circle*, an exhibition of more than 50 drawings, prints, and photographs from the private collection of the great French artist.

Cheekwood welcomed over 3,000 attendees to its 3rd annual **Holi Celebration**. The Festival of Colors is a Hindu celebration symbolizing a fresh start, much like spring itself. This educational event introduced visitors to the vibrant sights, sounds, and colors of Indian culture.



Each spring, children in every age group hunt for eggs at Cheekwood's **Great Spring Art Hop**. In April 2024, Cheekwood hosted 48 egg hunts in one weekend, with approximately 36,000 eggs filled with treats.



Cheekwood is a Center of Excellence designated by the Tennessee Urban Forestry Council and a Level III Accredited Arboretum by Arbnnet, which makes it the perfect setting to celebrate **Arbor Day**. Cheekwood's 2024 celebration included guided tours of the arboretum, tree-related art workshops, resource stations, and free saplings to plant. Within the over 2,100 trees on the property, Cheekwood has documented 1,268 deciduous trees, 576 evergreens, 16 deciduous conifers, and 242 dogwoods.



2024 SEASONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Summertime *at* Cheekwood

Throughout summer, Cheekwood’s lush gardens serve as a living backdrop for programs that engage the community and encourage enjoyment of its 55 acres. Cheekwood’s summer 2024 blockbuster exhibition, **TROLLS: Save the Humans**, was an installation in the gardens by Denmark-based recycle artist Thomas Dambo. His six larger-than-life troll sculpture installations were intertwined with Cheekwood’s unique gardens, trees, and historic landscape and brought imaginative storytelling, messages of sustainability, and appreciation for nature.



Inspired by the gardens at Cheekwood and the Cheek family, British artist **Ann Carrington** exhibited 33 elegant works throughout the Historic Mansion’s period rooms for **INTERVENTIONS: Ann Carrington**. Carrington is internationally known for working with discarded and found objects to create ornate sculptures out of items such as knives, spoons, buttons, cans, and coins. Her stunning, fused-metal creations engaged the estate in exciting ways.



Summer music programming flourished with the popular **Thursday Night Out** weekly concerts and **Under the Stars Concert Series**. In 2024, Cheekwood hosted more than 30 concerts from May to October. In August, visitors attended **Dog Nights of Summer** with their four-legged friends.



On Father’s Day weekend, guests strolled among nearly 100 historic vehicles displayed during **Exposition of Elegance: Classic Cars at Cheekwood**. The 2024 show featured 54 impeccably maintained classic cars, 35 pre- and post-war motorcycles, and 4 microcars owned by Lane Motor Museum.



At **Cheekwood Summer Camp**, children explored the gardens, made their own artistic masterpieces, planted herbs and veggies in the Cheekwood GROWS Garden, and more.

2024 SEASONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Cheekwood Harvest

More than **78,000 visitors** to *Cheekwood Harvest* enjoyed seasonal delights in the Pumpkin Village, with three pumpkin houses, a 9-foot-tall pumpkin topiary, Scarecrow Trail, and a Beer Garden. More than 75,000 pumpkins were incorporated into the displays and pumpkin patch for 2024.

The annual **Fall for Cheekwood** fundraiser raised nearly \$70,000 to help fund outreach programs such as **Destination Cheekwood**, a free student and family field trip initiative to engage K-12 students and their families with educational programs and unique curriculum.



The family-favorite **TOTS!** program returned with fun for little ones in the Bracken Foundation Children's Garden five days per week. Hands-on art and garden activities include Turtle Talks and storytime. Each week's theme is inspired by current exhibitions or seasonal festivals, encouraging exploration of art and the natural world.

Every year, Cheekwood hosts the largest annual Hispanic celebration in Middle Tennessee, **El Día de los Muertos**. In 2024, Cheekwood celebrated its 25th annual installment of Day of the Dead. The event has grown from modest beginnings in 2000, from five hours of programming to the current robust and colorful two-day celebration. Throughout this 25-year history, Cheekwood has relied upon an Advisory Council to function as ambassadors from the community and to ensure a genuine and powerful cultural gathering.



2024 SEASONAL HIGHLIGHTS

Holiday LIGHTS

Nashville’s beloved annual holiday celebration welcomed **80,000 visitors** to experience Cheekwood’s estate transformed into a dazzling winter wonderland during *Holiday LIGHTS*. To commemorate the **10th Annual Holiday LIGHTS** at Cheekwood Estate & Gardens, a towering Pixel Tree was added to the Bradford Robertson Color Garden, made possible by the AWC Family Foundation. Additionally, former Chief White House Florist **Laura Dowling** adorned the Cheekwood Historic Mansion with dazzling color and festive decorations. Dowling, who served as Chief Florist for the White House from 2009-2015, hosted workshops, lectures, and a book signing at Cheekwood during the holiday season.

The Museum exhibited ***Holidays at the White House with the First Ladies: Jacqueline Kennedy to Michelle Obama***, featuring photographs from the White House Historical Society and Presidential libraries illustrating the joyful times and intimate moments of the first families and their beloved pets during the holiday season.



Cheekwood offered half-price admission to members of the military and their families on Monday evenings during ***Holiday LIGHTS***. In collaboration with Truist, Cheekwood hosted a Holiday Gift Drive for military families.



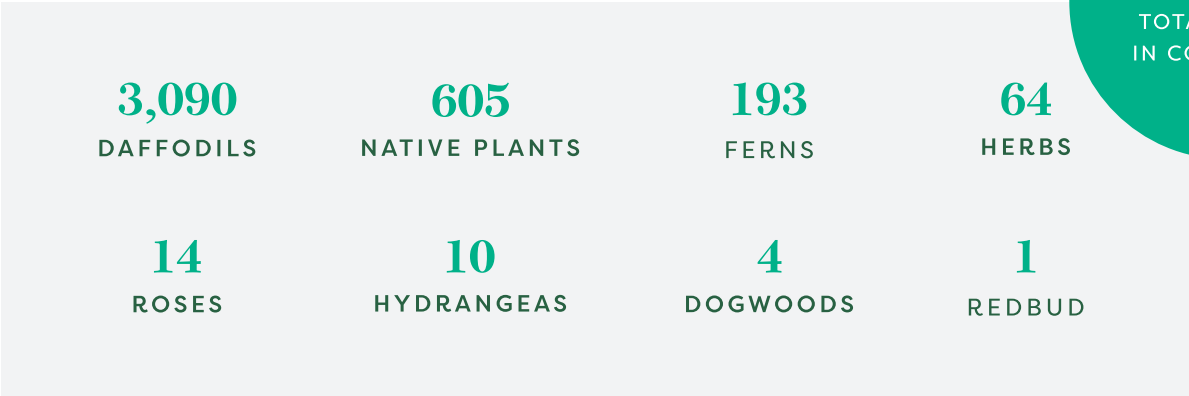

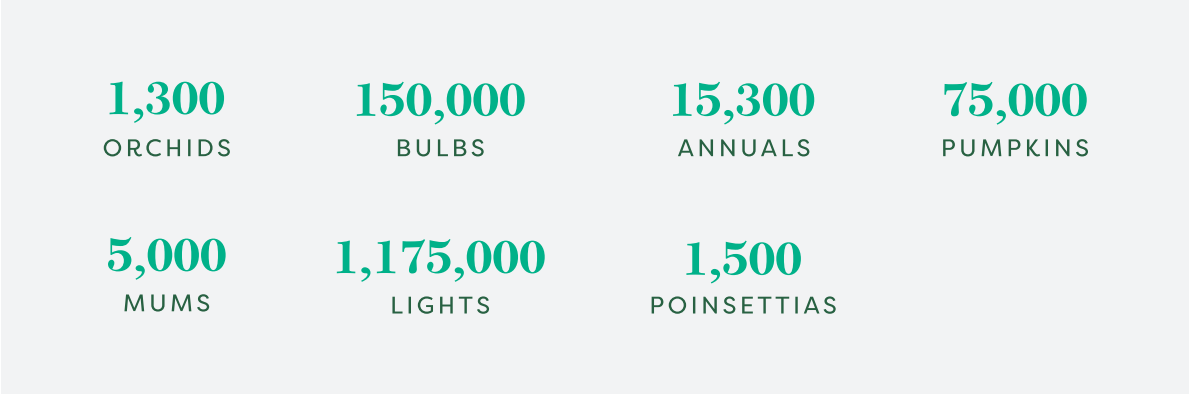

Garden Explorer

The interactive Garden Explorer tool was introduced in 2022 to engage Cheekwood visitors online and onsite. With 13 awe-inspiring gardens and expansive vistas, there are endless things to research and discover. With this tool, visitors can search plant collections by name, explore a map of the property, and follow curated tours featuring the arboretum and plant collections. An aerial view of the gardens aids in locating specific specimens, and images of searched plants in varying seasons further enhances the identification process.

The Cheekwood Gardening School

Spring 2024 marked the exciting launch of **The Cheekwood Gardening School**, offering educational classes designed specifically for the home gardener, from beginner to advanced levels. Instructors from local Master Gardener Associations, regional plant societies, and Cheekwood’s own in-house expert horticulturists helped enthusiasts learn new techniques, hone their skills, and expand their passion for gardening.

Since its launch, The Cheekwood Gardening School now offers programming in every season, with **48 total classes** taught and **762 registered students** in 2024.

Cheekwood Museum Acquisitions

AMERICAN POTTERY

Through the generosity of local collectors Molly and Rickey Schneider, Cheekwood received a gift of seven pieces of American Art Pottery. This recent donation complements Cheekwood’s collection of 19th century pottery, including past pivotal gifts from the Schneiders. Highlights include a Weller Pottery Hudson line vase created in the late 1920s with prunus blossoms decorated by Hester Pillsbury, a notable employee of Weller, and a monumental scale, hand thrown Rookwood vase decorated with orchids by prized designer, Albert Valentien. In addition, two other pieces by Weller and three Rookwood vases were included in the donation. The gift strengthens Cheekwood’s American Art Pottery collection and will inspire visitors for generations to come.

ANN CARRINGTON

Through the generosity of the Sandra Schatten Foundation, Cheekwood was able to acquire a silver bouquet sculpture, *Shomu-en*, by British artist Ann Carrington. As the 2024 *INTERVENTIONS* artist, Carrington was inspired by Cheekwood’s Japanese Garden of the same name. Her reimagination of ordinary household items like spoons, forks, and wing nuts creates this sculpture’s pagoda-like shape with bells hanging at the bottom of the bouquet, representing peace.

Destination Cheekwood

EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

In 2024, Cheekwood welcomed 13,000 students free-of-charge from 177 schools and 25 Metro Council Districts through educational field trips. Cheekwood’s annual investment in community outreach for 2024 was \$1.5 million, which went toward salaries, programming, materials and supplies, scholarships, and translation services. This also includes complimentary admissions, transportation, and Memberships. The staff has worked vigorously to impact the Middle Tennessee region through culture, education, environmental initiatives, and community outreach.

STUDENT FIELD TRIPS

Destination Cheekwood offers free field trips to all school groups from Tennessee, Southern Kentucky, and Northern Alabama. This outreach program gives children in grades pre-K through 12 the chance to spend the day at Cheekwood in the best outdoor classroom, learning about art, history, and botanical gardens. Students can learn about pollinators and garden ecosystems, understand how trees communicate, explore multiculturalism in the Blevins Japanese Garden, and more. Every field trip curriculum meets state standards and is led by trained educators.

FAMILY FIELD TRIPS

Families from Title I schools are invited to visit Cheekwood on weekends during peak festivals to enjoy a multi-generational experience at Cheekwood. In addition to complimentary admission, families receive an orientation with translation if needed, a complimentary meal or snack, and a one-year family Membership, encouraging return visits throughout the year.

AGENCY FIELD TRIPS

As *Destination Cheekwood* expands, organizations serving audiences with a diverse set of needs have been welcomed to experience Cheekwood and enjoy the beauty, solace and joy of the estate, museum, and gardens. In 2024, families from Renewal House enjoyed *Holiday LIGHTS*. In 2023, Nashville Freedom Schools enjoyed *Holiday LIGHTS* and Moves and Grooves families experienced the fall festivities of Cheekwood Harvest.

Cheekwood GROWS

Cheekwood’s newest community program, **Cheekwood GROWS**, is a free, immersive, and multi-faceted experience for third-grade students designed to teach gardening, healthy eating, and cooking skills. The garden is home to vegetable and fruit plants for tasting, flowers to attract pollinators, and herbs to give additional flavor. Students from four MNPS schools traveled to Cheekwood throughout 2024 for hands-on learning in an outdoor garden classroom, planting their own seeds and later returning with their families to prepare dishes with the ingredients they grew, including kale pesto and broccoli raab pasta.

Summer campers and participants in the TOTS! program also engaged in the Cheekwood GROWS Garden. Summer camp youth tended to the garden, cooked with fresh produce, and hosted their third “farmer’s market.” During the last week of camp, campers opened their own restaurant and invited family members to enjoy dishes they cooked themselves.



Cheekwood On the Road

This outbound program takes the Cheekwood experience beyond the estate to students in Title I schools as well as to pre-kindergarten students in area Head Start programs. Elementary students explore Cheekwood’s history, art collections and seasonal garden displays through educator and artist-led stations. Head Start toddlers enjoy storytime and arts and garden crafts inspired by the PNC Grow Up Great curriculum, and all books and materials remain in the classroom following the program.

Multicultural Celebrations

Cheekwood is committed to embracing cultures from around the world, hosting four major celebrations annually. Each festival highlights the traditions, music, dance, art, and cuisine of a culture and welcomes thousands to participate amid the beauty of the estate and gardens. Approximately **13,600 visitors** attended our four multicultural festivals in 2024, generating some of our highest attended days of the year.

HOLI | March 23

Cheekwood hosted the third annual Holi Celebration in 2024 after debuting in 2022. The Indian Festival of Colors is a Hindu tradition that symbolizes a fresh start, much like spring itself. Holi aligns perfectly with *Cheekwood in Bloom*, with its traditional color-throwing activities and dance performances adding even more vibrant colors to the spring roster and inspiring visitors of all ages.



Black Arts Bash | August 17

Cheekwood’s fourth annual Black Arts Bash paid tribute to Black history’s deep roots in Nashville and established it as one of the most anticipated events of the summer. The event spotlights both emerging and established artists across all mediums, including visual art, music, spoken word and poetry, dance, textiles, cuisine and more. The guidance and support of Cheekwood’s African American Cultural Advisory Committee ensures the experience is authentic, educational, and inspiring. The YMCA of Middle Tennessee distributed passes throughout the region to create awareness and expand the reach of the event.



Japanese Moon Viewing | September 15

Cheekwood hosted its 10th annual Japanese Moon Viewing festival, or *Otsukimi*, which takes place the night of the Harvest Moon, in partnership with the Consulate General of Japan and Japan American Society of Tennessee. The event highlights artists, entertainers, and vendors from the surrounding Japanese community. Otsukimi features tea ceremonies, mochi pounding, a Haiku competition, Japanese calligraphy, and bilingual lantern-lit tours of the Blevins Japanese Garden. The Nashville Bonsai Society contributes stunning bonsai, adding a layer of horticultural depth to the event.



El Día de los Muertos | November 2 & 3

Cheekwood’s popular Day of the Dead festival is its most longstanding cultural celebration, a two-day event in which family and friends honor those who have passed. El Día de los Muertos features vibrant altars created by local Latino partners, music, dance, cuisine, art, activities, and vendors. For 25 years, Cheekwood has delivered a truly authentic experience for visitors from Middle Tennessee and beyond.
