Cheekwood Welcomes New Board Members

Vicki McCluggage first came to Nashville on a visit in 1976 to address the Tennessee State Legislature on behalf of the US Cotton Council and moved to the city in 2013. A native Californian, Vicki began her career at CBS Television Network Sales, later moving to LORIMAR Television International to market and sell their highly successful television programs (including DALLAS; Falcon Crest; The Waltons; Eight is Enough; and Full House) abroad. Vicki has received the highest Volunteer Service Award from USC and is a past President of the Pasadena Showcase House for the Arts.

Julie Carell Stadler is the owner and CEO of Skyway Studios, one of the largest broadcast and media production facilities in the state. Along with her sisters, Julie is a co-owner of Carell Family, LLC, a commercial real estate investment firm based in Nashville. A native Nashvillian, she continues the family's legacy of supporting her community and especially the health and wellness of children.

Ryan McLaughlin Wood serves as the UBS South Central Market Executive, responsible for leading the UBS wealth management businesses in Tennessee, Kentucky, Louisiana, Arkansas, Alabama and Mississippi. In 2018, Yuri was selected to serve on the United States Hispanic Chamber of Commerce Board of Directors. Yuri received the first Avant-Garde MOSAIC Award for the "Advancement of Diversity" from the AAF-Nashville in 2015 and has been named to the Nashville Post's "In Charge" list of business leaders who are writing Music City's success story since 2010.

Deana Ivey serves as President for the Nashville Convention & Visitors Corp and has been with the organization since 1997, overseeing and coordinating the organization's marketing efforts as Nashville became a top global destination. Deana is co-producer of two, award-winning Nashville documentaries: For the Love of Music: The Story of Nashville and It All Begins With A Song. She is a recipient of the Nashville Business Journal Women in Music award and the Women in Business award by Nashville Lifestyles.

About Cheekwood

With its intact and picturesque vistas, Cheekwood is distinguished as one of the leading Country Place Era estates in the nation. Formerly the family home of Mabel and Leslie Cheek, the 1930s estate, with its 30,000-square-foot Mansion and 55-acres of gardens, today serves the public as a botanical garden, arboretum, and art museum with furnished period rooms and galleries devoted to American art from the 18th to mid-20th centuries. The property includes 13 distinct gardens including the Blevins Japanese Garden and the Bracken Foundation Children's Garden, as well as a 1.5-mile woodland trail featuring outdoor monumental sculpture. Each year, Cheekwood hosts seasonal festivals including Cheekwood in Bloom, Summertime at Cheekwood, Cheekwood Harvest and Holiday LIGHTS. Cheekwood is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is accredited by the American Alliance of Museums and nationally as a Level II Arboretum. It is a three-time voted USA Today Top 10 Botanical Garden and in 2021 was recognized by Fodors as one of the 12 Most Beautiful Gardens in the American South. Cheekwood is located eight miles southwest of downtown Nashville at 1200 Forrest Park Drive. It is open Tuesday through Sunday 9 a.m. – 5 p.m., with extended days and hours of operation depending on the season.
